#### Viticulture

- Acreage : 38 ha
- Grape varieties : Merlot 52% / Cabernet Sauvignon 44% / Petit Verdot 4%
- Average age of vines : 35 years
- Density of vines : 5000 to 7000 vines / ha
- Traditionnal viticultural practisis, grass cover & ploughing.
- Removal of excess buds, leaf-stripping and green harvesting

#### Enology

- Harvesting : mechanical or manual harvesting depending of the plots of vines

Strict sorting by hand on a table on reception of the harvest

- Wine-making : 32 temperature-controlled vats, racking of the must, pre-fermentary maceration, 3 to 4 weeks of vatting

- Ageing : from 12 to 15 months

40% new barrels, 40 % barrels of 1 year & 20 % barrels of 2 years.

Selection of 8 coopers

- Ageing on the fine lees
- Oenologist : Claude GROS

#### Bottling

- Bottling approved ISO 9001

#### Environment

- 2001 : establishment of a sewer specifically concieved for the treatment of organic waste
- 2006 : establishment of a recovery tank for the end's vats of phyto products
- **The estate is exempted of any tax pollution since 2001**
- In 1998 : rational pest management
- Since 2009 : 10 % of the vineyard in organic farming
- In 2010 : we replant forest hedges in order to protect the faunas auxiliary

#### Harvesting:

Merlot : from 13th Sept. to 29 th Sept.

Petit Verdot : on 30 th Sept.

Cabernet Sauvignon : from 26th to 30th Sept.

#### Blending:

55% Merlot,

42% Cabernet Sauvignon,

3% Petit Verdot

Yield : 41 hl

Alcohol : 13,4 % Vol.

Total Acidity: 3.6

Ph : 3.62
